Dates	Class Description
<p>4/11/10</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>Class One – Handler Control This class covers the basic requirements for a successful visit with your dog. We will learn and practice loose leash walking, passing other dogs and handlers, and going through narrow hallways and doorways with your dog at your side. We will also discuss appropriate leashes and collar options, and help you to select what is best for your dog. This class will benefit beginning handlers who can learn these skills for the first time, as well as more experienced handlers who wish to practice and reinforce good behavior.</p>
<p>4/18/10</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>Class Two – Obedience with Distractions This class continues leash work and covers basic obedience skills while a variety of distractions are presented. This will work further on handler control, as well as getting and maintaining your dog's focus during active visits. Distractions may include other dogs, people walking by using different voice tones, wearing hats or other distracting clothing.</p>
<p>4/25/10</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>Class Three – Interacting Appropriately with People/Exposure to Stimuli This class covers exposure to physical manipulation by people, including petting, hugging, managing in a crowd, and being examined. We will also practice having a person approach your dog in a way that simulates non-typical human behavior. You will learn handler skills to read your dog's body language and manage the situation appropriately. We will review typical signs of stress and other body language, which will be helpful not only during visits, but in all situations where your dog will need to communicate with you. Desensitizing and management techniques will be introduced.</p>
<p>5/2/10</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>Class Four – Comfort with Medical Apparatus This class covers exposure to medical equipment and handling your dog appropriately, including positioning the dog around the apparatus, asking your dog to climb into a chair for petting, and navigating successfully around items like a wheelchair, walker, or crutches. Different situations will be simulated for practice.</p>
<p>5/8/10</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>Class Five – Visit Commands and Simulation This class covers the commands your dog will need to know to be a successful therapy dog. We will practice commands such as go visit, leave it, and take it under varying circumstances. In this class, we will simulate a nursing home visit from beginning to end.</p>
